We know that you are anxious to learn when Keswick will be receiving the vaccine for our residents and staff. We are sharing with you information that Keswick has received regarding the vaccine as of the date noted at the top of this page. What We Know:

- Keswick has been designated to receive the Pfizer vaccine for COVID-19.
- The Pfizer vaccine is administered through two separate vaccines 21 days apart.
- Walgreen's is the pharmacy that will be on site to administer the vaccine to residents and staff.
- Residents will receive the vaccine in their rooms.
- Staff will receive the vaccines in a separate designated area in the building.

FACT: COVID-19 vaccines will not give you COVID-19

FACT: COVID-19 vaccines will not cause you to test positive on COVID-19 viral tests

Information provided by Pfizer regarding the Pfizer vaccine:

Will the Pfizer vaccine give me COVID-19?

No. The Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine does not contain SARS-CoV-2 and cannot give you COVID-19.

What if I decide not to have my loved one get the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine?

It is your choice for your loved one to receive or not receive the Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine. Should you decide not to have him/her receive it, standard medical care for him/her will not change.

Are there other choices available for preventing COVID-19 besides the Pfizer vaccine?

Keswick has been assigned Walgreen's as our pharmacy partner and we have been assigned the Pfizer vaccine by Governor Hogan.

Where will my loved one's vaccination information be recorded?

The vaccination provider may include your loved one's vaccination information in your state/local jurisdiction's Immunization Information System (IIS) or other designated system. This will ensure that your loved one receives the same vaccine when he/she receives the second dose
